What you need to know about home security

As an increase in burglaries is typically expected throughout the winter months, what do you need to know to protect your home?

n Garda Síochána recently started their winter phase of 'Operation Thor' which will run until the end of March 2021. An Garda Síochána anticipate an increase in the number of burglaries and associated criminal activity, as these usually occur in the winter months. The operation is designed to tackle this, by undertaking targeted enforcement and preventative activities.

These types of activities are one of the biggest trends in home security. The number of residential burglaries has dropped to an average of 6,980 from 2015 to the current year. a decrease of 39.8pc. This is due to preventative measures such as Operation Thor and increased home security. Getting ahead of the criminals is the best step in ensuring burglars are unsuccessful.

October 21st also saw the EU Focus Day on the prevention of domestic burglary. This involved the **European Crime Prevention** Network (EUCPN) and 26 European countries coordinating an EUwide burglary prevention

Speaking following the launch of the EU Wide Focus Day on Burglary, Crime Prevention Officer Sergeant Graham Kavanagh, said, "An Garda Síochána is committed in the fight against domestic burglaries and recently launched the annual Winter Phase of Operation Thor on 1st October, to tackle burglaries and associated criminal activity in the winter months. The rise in winter burglaries is a curve we can flatten by carrying out simple steps to protect our homes; i.e. Lock Up Light Up."

Use timer switches to

turn on lights, lock all doors and windows, store keys away from windows and letterboxes, and use your alarm.

There are three main types of security systems:

Unmonitored audible alarm system - this is a standard alarm system where the alarm will ring locally. You will need one of your neighbours, or someone in the house itself, to respond to the alarm activation.

Self-notification alarm system - this is where the alarm will send a text message to your phone and alert you that your alarm is activated.

Monitored alarm system

- a monitored alarm system will transmit a signal to a licensed PSA-certified alarm receiving centre, where trained operators will respond to the alarm activation, and contact

> your key holders and relevant authorities in the event of the verified activation.
